3 University Library e-book counts for each year include newly cataloged volumes acquired in prior years.

a Large decrease in LSC "Mini" due to items moved from LSC "Mini" to LSC once LSC re-opened.

b Increase from prior years due primarily to now counting volumes from a major international theses collection being processed over several years.

c Increase in E-books due to purchase of two large databases as well as a larger-than-usual addition of titles to several HeinOnline libraries.

d Increase in e-book titles due to increased acquisition of titles and increased catalog access to titles that may have not been counted previously.

e Slowing in 2011/2012 e-book growth due primarily to cancellation of ebrary electronic book collection in 2011/2012.
